Dear Friends,

As we all face very challenging times right now, I hope that you and your family are healthy and safe. The pandemic has tested many of us in ways we never imagined and even more so for the most fragile and vulnerable communities including our friends in Kenya.

Through your past generosity, the Cornerstone Project has provided support for the education, care and housing of vulnerable and AIDS-orphaned children in Kenya.

Today I am writing to ask for your continued help on behalf of all the students at the Nambale Magnet School in western Kenya who have been so drastically impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Students like Wendy.*

Wendy, age 11, is one of thousands of orphaned children in Africa but she has also been HIV positive since birth. Until the pandemic hit, Wendy not only attended the Nambale Magnet School but she also lived there.

She was admitted as a preschooler, and thanks to the Namable staff's love, care and a steady administration of antiviral drugs, she's grown to be a happy and healthy youngster.

Since April when the School closed, Wendy has been forced to work as a child laborer in order to survive -- on just one meal a day. Without a family, proper meals or anyone to administer her antiviral drugs, Wendy's health declined, and she needed to be placed in the hospital to get medical care.

Since the closing of the School, many other students are in similar situations, surviving on scarce food, very little fresh water and no way to afford expensive masks and sanitizers.

Because the Nambale School provides not just an education for its students but a means for their survival, we need your help now more than ever to reopen and restore the lives of these children.

How your donation will help:

- Pays for sanitary services and PPE supplies for a month to keep the campus sterile and the children safe during the pandemic
 Funds one month's salary for two additional teachers who are needed to accommodate smaller classrooms and social distancing
- **\$250** Provides each student with three nutritious daily meals for a month

Currently, only two of the eight grades of students have returned to the School but without assistance from generous donors like you, there won't be enough resources to accommodate the rest of the children in January.
